

2022 Summer Camp COVID-19 Policy for Campers and Staff

- Campers, volunteers, or staff who show symptoms of infectious diseases, including COVID-19, influenza, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), and gastrointestinal infections within 5 days of arrival for their designated camp week should stay home and get tested for COVID-19. Campers, volunteers, or staff who are at risk for complications with COVID-19 who test positive should consult with a healthcare provider right away for possible treatment, even if their symptoms are mild.
- It is **mandatory** for all campers, volunteers, or staff who test **positive** for COVID-19 to isolate regardless of vaccination status. Campers, volunteers, or staff do not need to quarantine, but will be required to wear a well-fitting mask for 5 days after confirmed exposure and then get tested. If negative they may proceed without precautions. If positive they will need to isolate as per CDC guidelines (see below). Camp directors/administrators should take time to carefully review up to date quarantine and isolation recommendations to understand their implications for campers and staff.
- Diagnostic testing is intended to identify current infection in campers, volunteers, and staff who start to show symptoms of COVID-19 while at camp. This includes any volunteer or staff member who is in contact with campers at any point during the week who are on property either overnight or who are on property for at least 24 hours over a 7-day consecutive week.
 - If a staff member starts to show symptoms after arrival, a diagnostic testing will be done on site with a rapid test kit.
 - If a camper starts to show symptoms after arrival, the parent will be called to pick up the camper to have him/her evaluated and treated by a healthcare provider. Parents may opt to have the camper tested on site for a charge of \$10 to cover the cost of the test. If they are found to be negative, the camper may resume camp activities for the remainder of the week if recommended by the examining health care official.

- A COVID-19 Health Screening Questionnaire will be filled out for every camper on arrival during the check in process (See below).
- Anyone who chooses to wear a mask will be supported in their decision to do so.
